

The Sentence

Defination - A combination of words that makes complete sense is called a Sentence.

Kinds of Sentences

There are four different kinds of Sentences:-

01) Statements Sentences: - Those which simply affirm or deny something are classed as Statements.

Eg. A man's success depends chiefly on himself. (Affirmative)

He did not get much help from others. (Negative)

2) Imperative Sentences: - Those which contain some command, request, entreaty or wish are classed as Imperative Sentences.

Eg. Rely chiefly on your own efforts. (Command)

Lend me a pen. (Request)

God save the Queen. (Wish)

3) Interrogative Sentences: - Those which inquire something are classed as Interrogative Sentences.

Eg. Have you finished your work?  
Where are you going?

4) Exclamatory Sentences: - These which express some sudden feeling, such as pleasure, anger or surprise, about something which has been said or done are classed as Exclamatory Sentences.

Eg. Hurrah! We have won the match!  
What a piece of luck!
